PROPOSED FEDERAL RULES ALLOW CITIES TO CREATE "QUIET ZONES"

SAFETY AND SILENCE MERGE IN THE QUEST FOR QUIET

For years residents near railroad crossings have wanted to improve their quality of life by silencing train horns, but the increased danger posed by quiet trains has bedeviled government safety regulators.

The Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) has studied Quiet Zones (QZ) since the early '90s. Consistent patterns of increased collisions occurred when train horns were silenced. So, any permissive regulations would have to give serious consideration to safety issues.

Accordingly FRA's proposed regulations would allow communities to create QZs in return for upgrading road/rail crossing safety from its current level. The required upgrades specified are those designed to increase safety at a greater rate than the higher risk associated with QZs - **a win-win situation**.

The FRA's new draft regulations require communities to adopt specific safety measures in order to create a QZ. Generally a community may qualify a QZ by closing crossings, or protecting each of its road/rail crossings with crossing gates; flashing lights; a few relatively minor expense items such as additional signage; and *one supplemental safety measure (SSM)*.

While SSMs are generally expensive and maintenance intensive, QWICK KURB® is the exception. Two 100 foot sections of QWICK KURB®, can be installed in about three hours at a fraction of the cost of other SSMs, with little maintenance thereafter.

FRA PROPOSED SUPPLEMENTARY SAFETY MEASURES (SSM) AND THEIR COST

Temporary Closure of a public highway-rail grade crossing. Annual cost Estimated at \$54,750. Requires daily set-up and removal of closure.

Four-quadrant gates. \$244,000. to \$318,000. Annual maintenance cost are estimated at \$3,750.

Mountable median with channelization devices. Under \$12000 for a typical crossing plus installation 100 ft. per side. Includes channelizer with 236 sq. in. of Type III reflective sheeting and Reflective Arcs.

Barrier curb medians with or without channelization devices. Requires widening of roadway with estimated minimum cost of \$60,000.

One-way streets with gates. Unknown costs.

Photo enforcement. \$55,000. to \$75,000. Annual operating cost \$20,000. to \$30,000.
